GNLU opens exhibition on Indian legal heritage

Ahmedabad: A photo exhibition on Indian legal heritage structures began at the Gujarat National Law University on Monday with 110 photographs, which highlight heritage structures of courts across the country.

Guiarat HC Justice M R Shah inaugurated the exhibition named 'Portraving the Judicial History of the Cities of India: the Photo History of Legal Heritage'. This exhibition is an attempt to recapture the evolution of judicial infrastructure of Indian legal system with its monumental heritage. The university students along with the faculty members have worked hardd to document the history of Indian courts. The exhibition is going to remain open till September 20.

re than 70 different types. The exhibition describes physical journey of Indian judiciary and express modernization of Indian court structure in time and space, said a statement from GNLU director Bimal Patel.

Justice Shah offered to contribute to the museum by providing original photographs of various old courts of Gujarat. He and assistant solicitor general Devang Vyas suggested that most of the district courts are being run in ancient buildings built during the British era and many of them are palaces.

There could be an extensive documentation of these structures they suggested.
