



GNLU to Impart Biz Skills among State's Women: 100 Young Women Comprising Students & NGO Workers to Undergo 3-Day Training in Social Entrepreneurship This July

A group of women is all set to get trained in social entrepreneurship, courtesy Gujarat National Law University (GNLU), British Council and SAATH Charitable Trust. Through this initiative, the varsity aims to build a community of youngsters who will use business models and entrepreneurial skills to create social impact.

Come July, GNLU will train 100 young women in social entrepreneurship through awareness and motivation. This project has been awarded to GNLU faculty Dr Ambati Nageswara Rao, assistant professor of social work by the British Council.

Rao elaborated that the project aims to create individuals who can act as a link between rural people and policy makers. "People sitting in ivory towers are not aware of the grassroots problems. ...
