A total of 129 undergraduate and post-graduate students were conferred degrees at the third convocation of Gujarat National Law University (GNLU) on Saturday.

The degrees were conferred on students by Supreme Court judge Anil R Dave in the presence of chief minister Narendra Modi. Nineteen gold medals were also awarded to students at the convocation.

Justice Dave told the graduating students to strive to continue learning.

He cited the example of 'Eklavya' who is known for his dedication towards his teacher even after thousands of years. GNLU director Prof Bimal Patel presented the institute's progress report. He gave a brief outlay about GNLU's future plans.
