Part-A Marks Attempt any five questions of from the following:

- Q.1 What do you mean by neighboring rights? Discuss their significance in the law of copyright. Explain the major changes which have taken place in the Copyright (Amendment) Act 2012 in relation to neighboring rights.
- Mr. Rajani is a famous film producer, director and script writer. In the year 2016, he Q.2 (11)produced a film named 'Mahabali' casting various famous actors of India. The film became very popular and soon it became a block-buster movie of the year. Thereafter, Mr. Rajani entered into an agreement for assignment of copyright in the movie 'Mahabali' with M/s Tiacom Ltd., for sale and supply of the movie through CDs and DVDs in the market against a lump-sum consideration of Rs. 50 Crore. After few months, Mr. Rajani entered into an agreement with Cinema TV for broadcasting of the said movie against a consideration of Rs. 40 Crore. M/s Tiacom Ltd. came to know about this deal. They approached the District court for claiming injunction against the same. The contentions by the plaintiff are that the broadcasting of the movie 'Mahabali' on Cinema TV will adversely affect the business. Moreover, he has entered into an assignment of copyright wherein all the exclusive rights are transferred in his favour. Therefore, Mr. Rajani is not entitled for another deal with Cinema TV. The contention of Mr. Rajani is that he had assigned only rights to sale and supply of the copies of movie and he is entitled to transfer broadcasting rights. Based on these facts, decide whether contentions of Mr. Rajani are valid. Answer in the light of applicable legal provisions and decided case laws. Explain the major provisions for the assignment of copyright in India.
- Q.3 Explain what constitutes infringement of copyright? Write a critical note on copyright (11) infringement and the role of internet in light of decided case laws.
- Q.4 The Copyright Act 1957 provides for various instances wherein a compulsory licence may be granted in certain situations. Critically discuss those provisions in light of its necessity. Highlight the drawbacks of the system of compulsory licence in the copyrighted works.

Q.5 "In the material world, laws are geared to protect the right to equitable remuneration. (11) However, life is beyond the material. It is temporal as well. Many of us believe in soul.
