t is indeed a proud moment for Gujarat National Law University (GNLU) as one of its students marks his place as an illustrious Rhodes Scholar. Meet Sameer Rashid Bhat (21), who hails from Anantnag in Kashmir, a final year BA LLB student at GNLU, who revealed he'd like to work for the people of his state in the area of policy making and in constitution law and human rights, once he completes

his scholarship.

Bhat finds himself among the five students selected from India for 2018. The list includes Nikita Arora, Government College, Girls, Punjabi University, Patiala (Women's Studies); Rahul Bajai, RSTM Nagpur University (Law);

Speaking with *Mirror*, Bhat said: "It is a great feeling, and I could not have done this without the support of my teachers at the university. I now look forward to going to Oxford University and study comparative constitutional law and human rights.

"I belong to Anantnag, but have lived in Srinagar. Once back from my stint at Oxford, I would like to work for

people in Kashmir," he added.

Bhat was selected after a highlycompetitive application and preliminary selection process. His selection
was finalised by the Committee comprising Gopalkrishna Gandhi, and
