Make your argument based upon ad coelum doctrine. Discuss the significance of the Causby case in refinement of the air laws.
- Q.2 Write a detailed analysis of Chicago Convention- Convention on International Civil Aviation, 1944 in shaping the Air Laws. Elaborate upon three major contributions of the Chicago Convention in the development of Air Law. Briefly discuss the role of ICAO in maintaining the order in Aviation.
- Q.3 Safety Management Systems (SMS) implementation in aviation has two components-Safety Risk Management (SRM) and Safety Assurance (SA). What is the role of Reactive, Proactive and Predictive Risk Management Activities under the SMS? Also signify the difference in these approaches of Reactive, Proactive and Predictive Risk Management Activities.
