- Q.1 Mr A.K. Jain is an advocate. He is a renowned criminal lawyer in Gujarat High court. While arguing in a case, he told the Judge, "If you are not giving order in my favour, I shall transfer you from this court". At one instance, he had tried to beat one of the Judge in the full bench. However, fellow lawyers and other judges could prevent him. Later, Gujarat High court has taken suo-moto contempt proceedings against Mr A.K. Jain and imposed one-month imprisonment along with fine of 5000 rupees. The High court also suspended the practice of Mr A.K. Jain up to 5 years. Is the High court's penalty maintainable? Substantiate your answer in the light of relevant statutory provisions and case laws. (08)

(b) Discuss accounting treatments of accrued fees, capital and revenue expenditure pertaining to a lawyer's profession.
