Rajkumar acquired 5 acre of the land by investing his own income. Son S1 also acquired property worth ₹ 5 lakhs by investing his personal income. S1S1 received 5 acre of land in gift from his maternal grandfather as token of love and affection. In 2009 Rajkumar, S1 and S1S1 died in a train accident. Ministry of railways declared a compensation of ₹ 5 lakhs to each deceased person in train accident. In view of given facts, distribute the total property of S1S1 among his eligible legal heirs.</p>	(07)
<p>Q.2 Rukmini, a Hindu female solemnized her marriage with Rakesh in 1980 and had three sons S1, S2 and S3. Rukmini received 2 acre of land from her father Surajsingh as her wedding gift and 3 acre of land as legal heir of her mother (Saroj) after her death. In 2006 Rakesh died leaving behind his self-acquired property worth ₹ 80,000, which was divided among his legal heirs. In 2007 son S1 died leaving behind his self acquired property worth ₹ 10,000 and his share in father's property. In 2009, son S2 and S3 gifted their entire property to a charitable institution which was working for welfare of orphans. S2 and S3 died without leaving any property. Rukmini died in the year 2015 and left behind her father Surajsingh, one brother, one sister, brother of Rakesh and one married sister of Rakesh. In accordance with the provisions of the Hindu Succession Act, 1956 divide the total property of Rukmini among her eligible legal heirs.</p>	(08)
